

LIST OF DIEP ESL COURSES

Beginning Core Courses

Beginning DIEP students begin their courses with limited knowledge of English vocabulary, word forms, and grammatical structures. In completing Beginning, students are expected to reach a basic level of communication in everyday written and spoken English.

ENSL 110	Beginning Grammar	Introduction to English grammar with emphasis on basic grammar usage in communicative contexts, both oral and written.
ENSL 111	Beginning Reading & Writing	Introduction to reading and writing as connected skills with emphasis on reading and producing texts (sentences and paragraphs) in communicative contexts.
ENSL 112	Beginning Listening & Speaking	Introduction to listening and speaking as connected skills with emphasis on effective communication.
ENSL 113	Beginning Reading	Introduction to reading in English with emphasis on strategies for developing reading fluency.
ENSL 114	Beginning Writing	Introduction to writing in English with emphasis on producing texts (sentences and paragraphs) in communicative contexts.

Foundation Core Classes

Foundation DIEP students begin their courses with a foundational knowledge of English vocabulary, word forms, and grammatical structures. In completing Foundation, students are expected to reach an intermediate level of communication in everyday written and spoken English.

ENSL 120	Foundation Grammar	Development of English grammatical skills necessary for clear communication, both oral and written.
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ENSL 121	Foundation Reading & Writing	Development of reading and writing as connected skills with emphasis on reading for critical thinking and producing texts (paragraphs) in communicative contexts.
ENSL 122	Foundation Listening & Speaking	Development of listening and speaking as connected skills with emphasis on effective communication.
ENSL 127	Foundation Writing	Development of writing in English with emphasis on producing texts (paragraphs) in communicative contexts.
ENSL 128	Foundation Reading	Development of reading skills in English with emphasis on strategies for fostering reading fluency and critical thinking.

Intermediate Core Courses

Intermediate DIEP students begin their courses with a more sophisticated knowledge of English vocabulary, word forms, and grammatical structures. In completing Intermediate, students are expected to reach an advanced level of communication in everyday written and spoken English and demonstrate an emerging ability to communicate in academic contexts.

ENSL 210	Intermediate Grammar	Development of English grammatical skills necessary for accurate usage in a variety of communicative and academic contexts, both oral and written.
ENSL 211	Intermediate Reading & Writing	Development of reading and writing as connected skills with emphasis on reading for critical thinking and producing texts (paragraphs and essays) in a variety of communicative and academic contexts.

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ENSL 212	Intermediate Listening & Speaking	Development of listening and speaking as connected skills with emphasis on effective communication in academic and non-academic contexts.
ENSL 214	Intermediate Reading	Development of reading skills in English with emphasis on strategies for expanding reading fluency and critical thinking.
ENSL 215	Intermediate Writing	Development of writing in English with emphasis on producing texts (paragraphs and essays) in a variety of communicative and academic contexts.

Advanced Core Courses

Advanced DIEP students begin their courses with an advanced-level knowledge of English vocabulary, word forms, and grammatical structures. In completing Advanced, students are expected to show mastery of communication in everyday written and spoken English and demonstrate an accomplished ability to communicate in academic contexts.

ENSL 220	Advanced Grammar	Intensive review of English grammar with emphasis on accurate grammar usage in a variety of communicative and academic contexts, both oral and written.
ENSL 221	Advanced Reading & Writing	Mastery of reading and writing as connected skills with emphasis on reading for critical thinking and producing texts (essays) using research in a variety of communicative and academic contexts.
ENSL 222	Advanced Listening & Speaking	Mastery of listening and speaking as connected skills with emphasis on fluency and effective communication in academic and non-academic contexts.

ENSL 227	Advanced Reading	Mastery of reading skills in English with emphasis on strategies for developing reading fluency and critical thinking.
ENSL 228	Advanced Writing	Mastery of writing in English with emphasis on producing texts (essays) using research in a variety of communicative and academic contexts.

Foundation-Advanced Skill-Building Courses

DIEP students take skill-building courses in addition to their core courses. These courses focus on improved pronunciation and mixed-skills practice in the areas of critical thinking, reading and discussion, and college-level writing.

ENSL 223	Pronunciation	English pronunciation improvement with emphasis on vowels, consonants, word stress, and intonation patterns. For students at an upper-intermediate level.
ENSL 225	American Ways: Reading & Discussion	Focus on reading a variety of academic texts about American history and culture for the purpose of critical thinking and discussion and with emphasis on group presentations, interviews, and interaction with native English speakers. For students at an advanced level.
ENSL 229	Conversational English I	Focus on discussion on a variety of non-academic topics with emphasis on critical thinking and effective communication.
ENSL 230	Conversational English II	Focus on discussion on a variety of academic and non-academic topics with emphasis on critical thinking

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and effective communication.

ENSL 231

Great Debates I

Focus on debate and discussion on a variety of non-academic topics with emphasis on critical thinking and effective communication.

ENSL 232

Great Debates II

Focus on debate and discussion on a variety of academic and non-academic topics with emphasis on critical thinking and effective communication.
